Game Capsule Summary

The visiting Orfordville Orioles jumped out to an early 4-0 lead over Verona Thursday night in a divisional battle for first place in Home Talent Night league action, but could not hold on as Verona came from behind to win 8-6. Both teams had multiple errors, but two infield overthrows and a couple of passed balls by the Orioles' defense proved to be crucial in the later innings.

Orioles starter Zach Jones pitched a complete game and appeared to have the high-powered Verona offense baffled until the 4th inning when he hit the leadoff hitter with a pitch after two strikes. The next batter singled up the middle and Verona then sacrifice bunted both runners into scoring position. Jones coaxed a grounder to third off Verona's cleanup hitter Derek Prochaska, but the low throw got past first base allowing the lead runner to score and Prochaska advanced to second base and scored on a base hit.

With the score at 4-2 in the top of the 5th, the Orfordville offense began to stall out against Verona reliever Matt Hau who had come on in the 4th to relieve Zach Spencer. Verona grabbed the lead for good in their 5th by adding three more runs – one unearned – on three hits, two walks, and another infield error.

The Orioles attempted to respond in the 6th but stranded two runners after two outs. Verona added three more insurance runs in their 6th to put the score at 8-4.

After one out in the 7th, Andy Risseeuw singled past short into left field and Cris Cartmill walked. Seth Hendricks drove a 3-2 pitch into the gap in left center field, scoring both runners, but Hendricks was caught in a rundown trying to take second base. Nate Henke grounded out to deep short to end the game.

Both Jones and Hendricks had two hits apiece in the game for the Orioles.

With the victory, Verona (6-1) moves ahead of Orfordville (5-2) into first place in the divisional standings of the Night League – South Section.
